WHAT

Soundbox is an all-ability inclusive music collective that brings together musicians aged 16-25 from East London to make and create new music.

The group uses a mixture of traditional instruments, music technology and singing, and offers a safe and supportive place to be creative and to experiment with new sounds and styles. Soundbox applies an open and exploratory approach to creating unique new music for the group.

Soundbox sessions include:

- Group creative composition and song-writing
- Musical improvisation
- Skills exploration
- Playing and working together as an ensemble

“My favourite thing about Soundbox is how spontaneous it is – someone plays something on their instrument and suddenly, 10 minutes later, it’s a brilliant piece of music and everybody is joining in. It is also really exciting because as people get used to their instruments and to each other, the music just keeps getting better and better, and more interesting.” Daisy, trumpet

The group works with a team of experienced professional musicians from London Symphony Orchestra, Drake Music and Spitalfields Music.

Our April Weekend course (Sat 8 & Sun 9 Apr) will focus on working together to devise and rehearse new music for a performance at the end of the weekend.

WHO

Soundbox is open to young people wanting to develop as musicians by creating music with others. Previous musical experience can range from an interest and enjoyment in school music lessons to studying music at university or Music College. Soundbox offers musicians of all abilities a new experience and a new challenge.

There will be a sharing to friends and family at 3pm on the Sunday afternoon.

WHERE

Soundbox meets at the **Brady Arts & Community Centre**, Hanbury Street, London E1 5HU. [Please note that the Brady Centre is a wheel chair accessible building.]

Soundbox is an integrated ensemble for disabled and non-disabled musicians. We endeavour to ensure that sessions are accessible, welcoming and engaging for everyone regardless of background and needs.

Soundbox is reliant on members being fully supportive and considerate to the needs of others within the group. We work together as a team, everyone as equals.
