

# Trainee Trustee Scheme

Spitalfields Music is a learning organisation, with a strong commitment to creating opportunities for people otherwise under-represented in the music sector. This extends into governance, where we offer up to five opportunities to shadow our board of trustees each year, so that Spitalfields Music and the wider arts sector can benefit from more diverse perspectives and experiences. - The programme will encompass four elements:
- A paid-for place on an online 'Trustee Leadership' course
- Observer status at the four Spitalfields Music board meetings held between January & December 2026
- A board 'buddy', in the form of an existing trustee, to help explain and navigate the responsibilities of directors of the charity
- Pre- and post-board meetings (online) with Spitalfields Music senior leaders so that those on the programme understand fully the agenda, papers and implications and impact of decisions made by trustees

Trainee trustees will be encouraged to participate fully in board meetings as they bring new perspectives and lived experiences. However, they will not be full trustees with legal or financial responsibilities during their 'traineeship', nor will they have a vote at AGMs or at other points.

This will be the fifth time Spitalfields Music has run the scheme. In the first four years of the scheme, we have worked with nineteen individuals from under-represented backgrounds. Several former Trainee Trustees have since taken up full trusteeships across the sector, including one joining the Spitalfields Music board.

This initiative is primarily available to:

- People of the Global Majority
- D/deaf, disabled and neuro-divergent people \*
- People aged under 35

\* We will help with the travel expenses for those based outside of London, and the costs of BSL interpreter/ caption facility/ access support worker, as required.

We have highlighted these groups in particular as they are under-represented amongst our trustee body at present. People who do not fall into one of the above categories are welcome to apply but are unlikely to be selected for interview.

## What you will gain from the scheme

- Formal and informal training on charity governance and what it is to be a trustee
- Access to a professional network of trustees and prospective trustees
- Meaningful opportunities to influence the organisation's strategic direction through participation in board meetings
- Access to informal mentoring with senior leaders and trustees

## What we are seeking

We are seeking proactive people who are interested in becoming a trustee but currently lack experience or knowledge of what is entailed. We will recruit on passion for the arts, commitment to becoming a trustee in the future, and awareness of the skills that you could bring to Spitalfields Music over the next year. We would ask that you make yourself available for all four board meetings over the course of the scheme, on 25<sup>th</sup> February, 7<sup>th</sup> May, 23<sup>rd</sup> July and 21<sup>st</sup> October 2026. Meetings are typically ninety minutes long and take place in the evening.

We may also invite Trainee Trustees to join our annual board awayday, which will be held on 26<sup>th</sup> November 2026.

Trustees are directors who serve the charity on a voluntary basis. They are legally responsible for the organisation. Trustees are elected for a three-year term, which can be renewed for a further three years through a majority vote by other trustees. In exceptional circumstances, a 75% majority of trustees present can vote a fellow trustee for a final three-year term, taking the maximum length of tenure to a total of nine years. Most trustees serve a six-year term. We are currently in the process of electing a new chair and expect this process to be completed by October 2024.

Trustees meet formally four times per year for board meetings and can be asked to sit on other standing committees - such as the Finance & Legal Committee and the Environmental, Social & Governance Committee - as well as other time-limited task groups.

Successful applicants will attend an online Trustee Leadership programme with a focus on arts, culture and heritage, which will take place over two half days: 4<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> February 2026, from 10am until 1pm. The first board meeting will take place on in late January in Central London from 6pm-8pm. Future board meetings will be confirmed in due course; they are likely to take place in late April; late July and late October.
